detailed information and features, such as a list of ingredients, time taken, instructions, etc. it is quite

challenging to organize all the data in a single place. Currently, she is storing the recipes in hand-written

notes², which is not the most efficient way of organizing multiple recipes as it could be lost or physically

damaged near cooking space. Furthermore, organizing recipes in binder wastes lots of time when she

searches for specific recipes. In short, my mom needs help with not only memorization and management

of recipes but also needs clear arrangement of recipes.

S: Do you have any other things you want to add?


C: No, it looks good. I think you need to improve on font sizes and design for sure.
