Mrs. Tostevin: So, with the search parameters, at which point do we put in the information for the item?

Q1. Interviewer: Here. The date found and the type. Is there any additional information you would like to add?

Mrs. Tostevin: Also, this interface, is it from the phone or only from the laptop.

Q2. Interviewer: Only from the laptop.

Mrs. Tostevin: So this one [refering to the barcode tab], I do like this one because it's just sort of a date. So instead of the way we write the dates on the masking tape, we just need to generate one and then it can get printed. So that one's fine. And then with the database one-- so the database is excel?
