Q1. Interviewer: So, what do you think about the functions of the data inputs page and the display table as the database for lost items

Mrs. Tostevin: Yeah, I think the searching and sorting aspect is nice. It would be nice if you could see more items and don't have to scroll because we do have a lot of items.
